

33rd SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME / B

This Sunday is the second to last Sunday of our liturgical year. As we approach the end of the Church year, our Gospel invites us to consider Jesus' predictions and teaching about the end of the world. In the context of Mark's Gospel, Jesus' words about this are spoken to his disciples as he prepares them for his passion and death. In today's Gospel, Jesus continues the teaching of watchfulness by offering his disciples which signs to look for that will indicate that the coming of the Son of Man is near. Jesus offers the lesson of the fig tree, a parable that teaches that if one knows how to read the signs, one can be prepared for the end times. Jesus also teaches, however, that no one knows when the end time will come, except the Father.
