

Why is St. Patrick depicted

St. Patrick depicted carrying a shamrock? Tradition claims St. Patrick used the shamrock as a teaching tool. He taught the people of Ireland about the Trinity using the leaves of a shamrock, also called a 3-leaf clover.



During his time in slavery, Patrick became increasingly devoted to Christianity through his growing prayer life.

DID YOU KNOW? There are 8 parishes named after St. Patrick in the Archdiocese of Toronto!

He wasn't Irish, at least not by birth. Born in Scotland, Patrick was captured by pirates at the age of 16 and taken to Ireland as a slave. He escaped slavery when, in a dream, God told him to leave Ireland by the coast. He reunited with his family, after having been in slavery for around six years.

Who was St. Patrick?



Ireland as a bishop. As an adult, Patrick studied in France and joined the priesthood. Later, he was ordained as a bishop by Pope Celestine I. It was at this time that he was told to go to Ireland and minister to the people there. For 40 years, he preached and converted the people of Ireland to Christianity. St. Patrick died in Ireland around 461 A.D.
