

V DOMENICA DI PASQUA / ANNO B

Diverse chiese, ma un'unica Chiesa. Il racconto della prima visita di Paolo a Gerusalemme dopo la sua conversione, mette in luce due elementi: Paolo vuole incontrarsi con i discepoli della Chiesa-madre perché sia riconosciuta, anche visibilmente, la sua comunione con i fratelli che sono, stati i testimoni privilegiati della risurrezione di Cristo; in tal modo viene sottolineata pure l'unità della missione evangelizzatrice della Chiesa. Come infatti in Gerusalemme aveva avuto il suo culmine e il suo compimento la missione di Gesù (cf il tema della «salita a Gerusalemme» nel tempo di preparazione alla Pasqua), così da Gerusalemme parte e si diffonde la missione degli apostoli e di Paolo, per raggiungere uomini di razze e diverse: «La Chiesa...dunque...cresceva camminava nel timore del Signore colma del conforto dello Spirito Santo» (prima lettura).

Sorgono le diverse Chiese nei punti nevralgici degli itinerari apostolici, ma tutte sono raccolte nell'unità della fede e della carità di Cristo. Ciò avviene nell'ambito di una Chiesa che si costruisce dopo la risurrezione di Cristo; ma il medesimo dinamismo di crescita e di espansione è vivo e vitale anche oggi. Il centro di unità si è spostato dalla Chiesa di Gerusalemme alla Chiesa di Roma: essa possiede modelli di organizzazione e di pensiero caratteristici della cultura in cui si è inserita e che ha pure trasformato. Ma non li impone alle Chiese locali le quali — incarnate in paesi con proprie culture — devono trovare una specifica fisionomia per l'annuncio dell'unico messaggio salvifico. Si instaura così un regime di unità nel pluralismo che non va esente da squilibri e tensioni..
