

ANNOUNCEMENT FROM CARDINAL THOMAS COLLINS

These past several weeks have seen a continuous flow of information and public outcry regarding the history of residential schools in Canada. In the coming weeks and months, we can also anticipate more news and opinions that will be most challenging and unsettling for many, including our clergy and staff. We have also seen acts of vandalism and violence against Catholic churches throughout the country in recent days.

A recent poll suggested that only 10% of Canadians have a thorough understanding of the history of residential schools. Let us pray for the children who died in residential schools throughout Canada and for all those impacted by this tragedy, that there may be healing founded on truth and that the Spirit will inspire our ongoing commitment to reconciliation. We pray to the Lord.

CCCB'S RESPONSE TO THE RESIDENTIAL SCHOOLS ISSUE

From Msgr. Frank Leo, Jr. General Secretary: Since the discovery of 215 unmarked graves at the former Indian Residential School in Kamloops, BC, the Church in Canada, at all levels, has come under enormous pressure in various forms and from various quarters, including all three levels of government, news media locally and nationally, Indigenous leadership, and the general public, including the Catholic faithful.

The purpose of this message is to inform you, in general terms, of the work which has been taking place behind the scenes at the CCCB since the Kamloops discovery and of the opportunities foreseen for communal discussion and discernment going forward:

Since the discovery in Kamloops, the Bishops Working Group on Indigenous Initiatives and the members of the Executive Committee have been meeting via videoconference almost daily to reflect on the urgent situation. Conversations are also being held with the Holy See regarding this matter.

The President has convoked a special meeting of the Permanent Council to discuss IRS gravesites, fundraising

initiatives/requests, media and political pressure, and the repeated request for a papal apology on Canadian soil.

The CCCB Secretariat has contacted three crisis management firms to assist the Conference navigate through this critical situation.

A significant block of time has been reserved on the schedule of the upcoming meeting of the Plenary Assembly to discuss and discern together our common efforts toward reconciliation with Indigenous Peoples.

ROADMAP FOR REOPENING PLAN: STEP 3

Last week, the provincial government approved that as of Friday, July 16th, we will be moving to Step 3 of the "Roadmap for Reopening" plan. Following are the updated guidelines from the Archdiocese of Toronto:

For Sacramental celebrations: There is no capacity limit for places of worship. However, physical distancing of 2 meters is still required between parishioners attending Mass who are not from the same household.

For funerals: The Bereavement Authority of Ontario is no longer implementing a maximum capacity restriction for funerals. Similar to other Sacramental celebrations, there are no capacity restrictions for funerals as long as 2 meters of physical distancing can be maintained between attendees who are not from the same household.

We are ensuring that the WorshipSafe guidelines are followed. The usage of masks indoors will continue at this time, even for those who are fully vaccinated.

Congregational singing is not permitted at this time; however, a cantor or small choir may be utilized if participants are 3 meters from one another and any member of the congregation.

Livestreaming of services will continue and the dispensation from the Sunday obligation continues. The elderly and those with compromised immune systems or other health conditions should be encouraged to exercise caution about any outings, including attendance at Church.

We are hopeful that in the weeks ahead, we will be able to remove additional restrictions that have been in place over the past year. Thank you once again for your patience and flexibility as we care for the faithful and one another.

Next Sunday, July 25th, is the First Annual "Day for Grandparents and the Elderly" promulgated by Pope Francis.

They are the words that he repeats to you today, dear grandfathers and grandmothers, dear elderly friends. "I am with you always" are also the words that I, as Bishop of Rome and an elderly person like yourselves, would like to address to you on the first World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly. The whole Church is close to you – to us – and cares about you, loves you and does not want to leave you alone!
