Jesus descended into the river to sanctify its waters and to give them the power to beget sons of God. The event takes on the importance of a second creation in which the entire Trinity intervenes.

WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY 2021 JANUARY 18 – JANUARY 25

We are celebrating the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity from Monday, January 18th to Monday, January 25th. The theme this year is: *Abide in my love and you shall bear much fruit* (John 15:5-9). This calls on us to pray and to work for reconciliation and unity in the church, with our human family, and with all of creation. Drawing on the Gospel image of vine and branches, it invites us to nourish unity with God and with one another through contemplative silence, prayer, and common action. Grafted into Christ the vine as many diverse branches, may we bear rich fruit and create new ways of living, with respect for and communion with all of creation.

THE SUNDAY OF THE WORD OF GOD THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: JAN. 24

Pope Francis instituted 'The Sunday of the Word of God' to be held every year on the third Sunday of Ordinary Time. This year, the celebration will be held on Sunday, January 24th – the Mass will be live streamed at 11:00 am.

From the Vatican: This day reminds us, pastors and faithful alike, of the importance and value of Sacred Scripture for the Christian life, as well as the relationship between the Word of God and the liturgy: "As Christians, we are one people, making our pilgrim way through history, sustained by the Lord, present in our midst, who speaks to us and nourishes us. A day devoted to the Bible should not be seen as a yearly event but rather a year-long event, for we urgently need to grow in our knowledge and love of the Scriptures and of the Risen Lord, who continues to speak his word and to break bread in the community of believers. For this reason, we need to develop a closer relationship with Sacred Scripture; otherwise, our hearts will remain cold and our eyes shut, inflicted as we are by so many forms of blindness".

From Cardinal Collins: Marriage Sunday highlights the importance of the Sacrament of Marriage and complements World Marriage Sunday celebrations that take place across North America. POPE FRANCIS PROCLAIMS THE UPCOMING YEAR TO BE DEDICATED TO THE FAMILY

From the Associated Press – Vatican News: The Pontiff offers simple advice to help bickering families keep peace. On Sunday, December 27th, Pope Francis proclaimed the upcoming year be dedicated to the family as he doubled down on one of his papal priorities and urged renewed attention to his 2016 document on family life.

Pope Francis announced the upcoming year of the family would begin on **March 19th**, the fifth anniversary of his document "The Joy of Love." Among other things, the document opened the door to letting divorced and civilly married couples to receive Communion, sparking criticism and even claims of heresy from conservative Catholics.

The Pope penned the document after summoning bishops from around the world to debate how the Catholic Church can better minister to families. While the divorce-remarriage issue dominated headlines during the back-to-back synods, the discussion also touched on ministering to gay people and other "non-traditional" families.
